
## Conference Facilities



The conference dinner takes place at the Refectory (Mensa), Innstraße 29 (marked in blue on the map), just a short walk from the WIWI building.







## Lunch Options

**Good news!** You will receive vouchers for the refectory (Mensa) during the registration process. One voucher is valid for a main dish, plus salad or dessert and a drink (max. 12 Euro).

In any case, the refectory (Mensa) is the most affordable and quickest choice, with prices ranging from 3.60 to 8 Euros for guests. Another quick option is the Cafeteria Mensagebäude (marked in red on the map, p. 5), where you can buy sandwiches or other snacks. Please note that you can only pay by EC card or credit card at both the refectory and the cafeteria. ## Reaching the conference venue from within Passau

### By bus

There is a bus stop called “Universität” next to the conference building (marked in bright red on the map, p. 5). Lines 8 and 9 go to the central bus station (ZOB). Make sure that ZOB is written on the front of the bus if you want to go in that direction. If you want to go from ZOB to the conference building, take line 8 Kohlbrück/Erlebnisbad or line 9 Kohlbrück/Erlebnisbad and get off at the “Universität” bus stop.

A single ticket costs 2.50 EUR. If you want to take the bus more often, it is advisable to buy a multi-trip ticket. You can use it to take the bus four times and then you have to buy another ticket. This ticket costs 8 EUR. Unfortunately, there is no weekly ticket available. If you already have a Deutschland Ticket or a Bayernticket, you can simply use it to go by bus, but please be aware that you cannot buy these two tickets in the bus. Under this link you will find a map with the bus network. Line 8 is marked in pale pink and line 9 in darker pink.

### On foot

You can easily reach the site on foot. Distances are mostly not far. The main bus station (ZOB) is 600m, the train station is 1.1 km from the conference venue.

### By taxi

If you prefer a taxi, call +49-851-57373 ([taxi-zentrale-passau.de](http://taxi-zentrale-passau.de)). They roughly cost around 10 to 15 EUR for a ride from the train station to the venue.
